RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission receive the following update on LAFCO-related legislation for the 2019-2020 Legislative Session. No Commission action is requested.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION AND BACKGROUND

The State Legislature is in the first year of the 2019-2020 legislative cycle. February 22 is the last day for bills to be introduced; as of now, CALAFCO is currently tracking two bills, one of which has been identified as a spot bill. The following is a summary of bills related to LAFCO:

AB 213 (Reyes D – San Bernardino) Local government finance.

Property Tax Revenue Allocations: Vehicle License Fee Adjustments

AB 213 restores vehicle license fee (VLF) revenue for inhabited city annexations. Payments would come from ERAF which is backfilled from the general fund. This bill reinstates financial incentives for cities to annex, and provide services to, unincorporated islands and adjacent disadvantaged communities.

This bill is the same as AB 2268 (Reyes) from last year, which this Commission took a support position on. The bill was also supported by CALAFCO.

SB 99 (Nielsen R – Northern Sacramento Valley) Agricultural land.

As introduced, this bill would make non-substantive changes to provisions of the Williamson Act. However, this is a spot bill and the final language will likely change considerably from this introductory language.
