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## **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Commission receive the following updated information regarding LAFCO-related legislation and consider taking a Support position for Assembly Bill 2238 (Aguiar-Curry), Assembly Bill 2268 (Reyes) and Senate Bill 929 (McGuire).

## **REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION AND BACKGROUND**

On May 17, CALAFCO sent out a call for legislative action on three bills for which CALAFCO has taken a support position. CALAFCO is requesting each LAFCO also send letters of support for these bills.

### **AB 2238 (Aguiar-Curry) – Hazard Mitigation Plan Consideration**

This bill adds a factor for LAFCO consideration in the review of a proposal. That factor is information contained in a local hazard mitigation plan, information contained in a safety element of a general plan, and any maps that identify land as a very high fire hazard zone pursuant to Section 51178 or maps that identify land determined to be in a state responsibility area pursuant to Section 4102 of the Public Resources Code, if it is determined that such information is relevant to the area that is the subject of the proposal.

Staff recommends the Commission consider taking a support position for AB 2238. A draft letter of support and the Legislative Counsel's Digest of AB 2238 are included as ***Attachment B***.

**AB 2268 (Reyes) – Vehicle License Fee Adjustments: Inhabited Annexations**

This bill restores VLF (vehicle license fee) funding for inhabited city annexations. Payments would come from ERAF which is backfilled from the general fund. This bill reinstates financial incentives for cities to annex, and provide services to, unincorporated islands and adjacent disadvantaged communities. CALAFCO has historically supported this bill each year. Note: This is not the same bill that was discussed at the March 28 LAFCO meeting, which proposed reinstating VLF funding for newly incorporated cities—AB 2491 (Cooley).

Staff recommends the Commission consider taking a support position for AB 2268. A draft letter of support and the Legislative Counsel's Digest of AB 2268 are included as **Attachment C**.

**SB 929 (McGuire) – Special District Websites**

This bill would, beginning on January 1, 2020, require every independent special district to maintain an internet website that clearly lists contact information for the special district, unless certain exemption standards have been met. Independent special districts who are unable to maintain a website because of a hardship, such as inadequate staff, financial resources, or access to broadband, may be exempted on an annual basis by a resolution adopted by the governing board with detailed findings.

Staff recommends the Commission consider taking a support position for SB 929. A draft letter of support and the Legislative Counsel's Digest of SB 929 are included as **Attachment D**.
