AGENDA ITEM #9: CONSIDER NOMINATIONS FOR THE CALAFCO
GOVERNING BOARD AND FOR THE CALAFCO
ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission receive the following information related to the CALAFCO Achievement Awards and openings on the CALAFCO Board of Directors openings and provide direction to staff should the Commission wish to submit nominations on either, or both, of these items.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION

This item is on the agenda at the request of CALAFCO, who is requesting its member LAFCOs to submit their nominations for various awards and/or the names of their Commissioners who want to run for various seats on its governing board.

BACKGROUND

CALAFCO Board Nominations

CALAFCO has opened the nomination period for member Commissioners who want to serve on the CALAFCO Board of Directors. Members will be elected by regions, with the Central Region having two seats up for election: A city representative and a public member representative. Nominations may be submitted for either of these Board positions. Either a regular commissioner or an alternate from a member LAFCO may serve on the CALAFCO Board. The nomination period closes on Monday, July 29, 2013.

Attachment A contains an explanation from CALAFCO on the process. At this time, it is unknown whether the incumbents, Matthew Beekman (city from Stanislaus) or Julie Allen (public from Tulare) will seek re-election.

CALAFCO Achievement Awards

CALAFCO is encouraging its members to nominate persons or projects for the 2010 CALAFCO Achievement Awards. The awards recognize the outstanding achievements of individuals, LAFCOs, local agencies and organizations in striving towards the goals and principles of Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg and service to the association. The Commission may wish to nominate someone or some project for any of the following awards:

- Outstanding CALAFCO Member
- Distinguished Service Award
- Most Effective Commission
- Outstanding Commissioner
- Outstanding LAFCO Professional
- Outstanding LAFCO Clerk
- Project of the Year
- Government Leadership Award
- Legislator of the Year
- Mike Gotch Courage and Innovation in Local Government Award

Attachment B contains more explanation on each of the awards. The nomination period for any of these closes on Tuesday, July 9, 2013. Staff suggests that the Commission consider nominating itself for either "Most Effective Commission" or for "Project of the Year" for its work in the Shingle Springs Rancheria Reorganization. The project was structured to be "watertight," ensuring that the 20-year-old issues were resolved effectively and without additional lawsuits. When described to others, the project has garnered praise statewide.

The award ceremonies and the elections will take place during the August Conference at Resort at Squaw Creek in North Lake Tahoe. Direction can be given to staff to prepare the appropriate materials should the Commission wish to submit a nominee for either of these two categories.
