## **RECOMMENDATION**

None. This is item is for information purposes only and is intended to be a summary of LAFCO-related legislation.

#### REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION AND BACKGROUND

The Legislature adjourned on Friday September 11, 2009. The following is just a summary on the final actions for some bills that staff has been monitoring in the past year:

#### Signed Into Law

**AB 1582** (Assembly Omnibus Bill) - CKH omnibus bill that makes various changes including one year to establish spheres for new districts, waiver of protest hearing for annexations involving railroads, conforming information required for written protests, clarifying language on new cities elections by or from districts, and several other technical changes.

#### **Bills on the Governor's Desk for Signature**

**SB 113** (Senate Omnibus Bill) - This bill includes a number of changes requested by CALAFCO in other local government laws, it extends the sunset for the R&T 99 property tax exchange agreement negotiation process to 1 Jan 2015, it cleans up some wrong references in CSD and CSA law, it clarifies where a CSD must send name change notifications, and eliminates obsolete language on appropriation limits for new cities.

**SB 215** (Wiggins) - This bill adds Regional Transportation Plans (including the sustainable community strategy or alternate strategy) to the Section 56668(g) factors a LAFCO must consider in the review of proposals.

AB 853 (Arambula) - Disadvantaged Community Annexations — Would provide procedures for annexing unincorporated "fringe communities" and unincorporated island communities, as defined, to a city under specified circumstances, including provisions for a revenue neutrality agreement between the affected local government entities. This is a two-year bill.
