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#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Commission:

1. Receive and discuss the information related to the municipal services review and sphere of influence update for the West El Largo Community Services District;
2. Open the public hearing on this matter;
3. Accept the statutory exemption from environmental review as the appropriate environmental review;
4. Adopt the municipal service review and sphere of influence update for the West El Largo Community Services District; and
5. Direct staff to complete the necessary filings and transmittals as required by law.

#### **REASON FOR RECOMMENDED ACTION**

The municipal service review (MSR) is required by State Law to serve as a guidance document for any future boundary changes to the West El Largo CSD. State Law also requires that a municipal service review for an agency be performed before the Commission can update a sphere of influence (SOI). The Commission opened the public comment period on the Draft MSR/SOI at the December 2, 2009 Commission meeting; however, no comments were received from the CSD Board or the public. The Final MSR and affirmation of the current SOI is now returned to the Commission for final adoption.

#### **BACKGROUND**

This study analyzes the agency's ability to provide existing and future residents with roadway maintenance within its service area. The MSR was prepared to meet the

requirements and standards of the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (CKH). The service review was prepared using the Service Review Guidelines prepared by the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR).

The fundamental role of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is to implement the CKH Act (found in Government Code §56000, et seq.), consistent with local conditions and circumstances. LAFCO's decisions are guided by the CKH Act. This MSR will assist the Commission and its staff when considering actions that will affect the West El Largo Community Services District.

The MSR found that the West El Largo CSD is currently providing services at levels consistent with the residents' expectations, as identified by the West El Largo CSD Board of Directors. Specifically, the MSR provided agency analysis based upon the six factors of analysis contained in OPR's Service Review Guidelines referenced above:

1. Growth and population projections for the affected area.
2. Present and planned capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services, including infrastructure needs or deficiencies.
3. Financial ability of agencies to provide services.
4. Status of, and opportunities for, shared facilities.
5. Accountability for community service needs, including governmental structure and operational efficiencies.
6. The potential effect of agency services on agricultural and open space lands.

Throughout the analysis portions of the report, LAFCO staff did not identify any substantial areas for improvement or current issues faced by the agency that needed to be addressed or resolved as a part of this MSR. The MSR did note, however, that there are two parcels within the SOI that are not within the District's service boundary. The owners of these properties currently utilize the District's roadways since they provide the sole access to their parcels. This continues to pose a potential "free rider" problem, though there is no immediate plan to extend the service boundary to be coterminous with the SOI due to the cost involved in the annexation process. Based on the MSR's findings, staff recommends the affirmation of the current sphere of influence for the West El Largo CSD, which is mostly concurrent to district boundaries but it encompasses those two parcels to the west.
